
# PGY-1 Pharmacy Residency Program









## **Pharmacy Services**

The pharmacy department provides 24 hours a day, seven days a week comprehensive pharmaceutical care to all patients within the hospital.

The outpatient pharmacy provides prescription services to patients seen in CHOC Register Clinic (Specialty Care), CHOC Orange Community Clinic (Primary Care), patients being discharged from the hospital and CHOC associates.
