CHOC Adolescent to Adult Bridge Program Decision-Making Support Guide

At 18 years old, patients will be asked to sign for their medical care, make medical decisions, schedule visits, and talk with the doctor at appointments. If your child is unable to do these things on their own, there are several types of support options available. This is general information. For specific questions, talk to your Regional Center worker, or a CHOC social worker.
